ADOLF HITLER'S LAST DAYS

Three weeks after the collapse of Nazi Germany Major Ivan Nikitine, deputy chief of the Soviet Security Police, reported in Berlin that the Fuehrer had neither shot himself in his underground shelter nor been cremated near by as generally believed-if, indeed he had perished at all. That was the start of rumours still half believed that Hitler was not dead.

An immediate, exhaustive enquiry was ordered by Allied Intelligence in 1945, and the details of Hitler's last days were gradually reconstructed. The twenty-eight people who had been close to the Fuehrer during the Battle of Berlin and had been captured by Western Allied Forces were questioned and their stories checked and cross-checked. Mountains of documents were studied. The true story of the dictator's end was slowly pieced together.

At approximately, 2.30 of the afternoon of 30th April 1945, Adolf Hitler sat down beside his wife in the underground Fuehrer bunker, put the barrel of a Walther automatic into his mouth and pulled the trigger while Eva Hitler hit into a vial of cyanide. At 10.30 that night what little remained of their bodies-which had been repeatedly drenched with petrol and burnt in the chancellery garden-was buried by General Rattenhuber and a detail of Elite guardsman. All night long an artillery barrage from the Russian lines churned up the whole area. Hitler's bones were scattered as his Thousand Years Reich had been.

The beginning of the end was the Fuehrer's birthday-20th April 1945. In the Fuehrerbunker, fifty feet below the surface of the chancellery garden, the chiefs of the German Armed Forces and the Nazi party had gathered to pay their respects to the Supreme War Lord. Boots shone and decorations glittered, but most of the faces were haggard. The decimated German armies were falling back on every front. The Russians threaten Berlin; the Western Allies had crossed the Elbe and were racing to meet them.

Since his narrow escape ten months before from the General's plot and the brief-case bomb attempt on his life, Hitler had suddenly become an old man, stooped and hunched, dragging one foot and with a noticeable tremor in his left arm. But his voice was as incisive, his eyes as bright, as ever.

In the conference that followed, the satraps could hardly believe their ears when Field Marshal Wilhelm Keitel hesitatingly swept him aside, "Nonsense" he rasped. "The Russians will meet their bloody defeat yet before the impregnable gates of Berlin. And then we will roll the allies back into the sea." The mesmeric eyes swept over them and no one moved.

Reichsmarschall Hermann Goering broke the spell for a few moments. Germany would inevitably triumph, said the corpulent master of the once mighty Luftwaffe, but it would be safer from the Fuehrer to direct his troops from the mountain fastness of Berchtesgaden. Hitler glared, "What are you really recommending," he snapped, "is that you should leave for a safer place. You may go by all means." In stony silence, Goering saluted with his jewelled marshal's baton and took his leave; a few minutes later, followed by a convoy of fast trucks loaded with treasure his armoured Mercedes was streaking for Bavaria and he thought safety. Hitler had turned back to his maps and was explaining his strategy. "We knew" one Veteran General said later "that most of the divisions with which he was manoeuvring were no longer effective units. But listening to him most of his followers felt there might still be a chance.

There was one man in the Fuehrer bunker that day who could shake off the hysteria that Hitler had induced and who was primarily interested in his people's welfare: Albert Speer, Minister of Armaments, the brilliant industrial brain of the Reich. He had repeatedly produced the impossible in guns, planes and tanks. Early in March, Speer had discovered Hitler's terrible plan for the annihilation of the Reich in the event of defeat. Detailed orders had gone to all District Party leaders to destroy, as Allied troops advanced, all important industrial plants, public utilities, mines and stores of food and clothing. The military were instructed to blow up all key bridges, railway and canal installations and locomotives. Speer made a whirlwind tour of the country and persuaded key Gauleiters and generals to hold up the execution of Hitler's decree. Speer picked Hitler's birthday as his best opportunity as his final plea. "Should the People give up", the Fuehrer had said, with a cold stare, "they would demonstrate that they have no moral worth. They would deserve destruction".

Speer decided that he would sabotage the leader's Holocaust if it cost him his life. At the risk of a Gestapo hand on his shoulder, he rocked round Germany again Gauleiter Karl Kaufmann of Hamburg promised that all important port would not be demolished. The others nervously followed the suit. To cripple the fanatics Speer ordered all high explosives not in military hands to be put into wells and flooded mineshafts. The order saved many hundreds of industrial plants.

Meanwhile, Hitler had completed elaborate plans to throw the Russians back from Berlin. The counter attack was to be led by SS General Gelix Steiner "Any officer who keeps a single man back from this operation," Hitler screamed into the telephone, "will forfeit his life within five hours".

On the afternoon of 22nd April the Fuehrer announced to his staff the first victory of the new campaign. Heinrich Himmler sycophantic leader of the S.S., had reported by telephone that Steiner's offensive was in full swing and that Russian troops were falling back from Berlin. The several messages were laid in rapid succession in front of Colonel-General Alferd Jodel, chief of operations. For several minutes, Jodel could not bring himself to speak. Then Hitler noticed his face . . . "Well ? Well" he demanded "Mein Fuehrer" said Jodel, "Steiner has not attacked Marshal Zhukov's armour is reported in Berlin. Hitler stared straight ahead, his face a slowly purpling mask. "The SS," he

whispered, "I have been betrayed by the SS. Traitors— all of ! "he roared, "Dogs of Traitors !"

For three hours Hitler raged on. Finally, he staggered back to his chair. "The Third Reigh has failed," he gasped hoarsely. "Nothing remains except for me to die. I shall remain here and wait for the end. Then I shall shoot myself. There's nothing left to fight with. Get negotiating with the Allies."

The last two days in the Fuehrerbunker were the strangest of all. Early on the morning of 29th of April Hitler married his mistress Eva Braun. Late that night an orderly summoned everyone to the main bunker. The Fuehrer wishes to say good-bye when they were assembled, Hitler shook hands silently with each in turn. "His eyes were glazed", said one witness. "He already seemed far away. At two o'clock on 30th April, Hitler had his lunch as usual. He was pale and quite, but ate with apparent enjoyment. Then he and his wife went out to the main corridor where Bormann Goebbels and the principal aides were waiting. They shook hands silently and returned to their suite. The door slammed and one of the Fuehrer's body guard planted himself in front of it. A moment later, a shot crashed. The THOUSAND-YEAR-REICH had come to an end.

धक्के मार कर निकाल दें। छोटे-छोटे शहरों तथा गाँव को पार करके यमुना नदी के किनारे बसे गाँव, बर्नीघाट पहुँच गए। सूर्य सिर पर चढ़ा हुआ था।

बर्नीघाट में यमुना नदी के तट पर अपने रंग-बिरंगे तम्बू लगाए और सपनों में खो गए। शौचालय नहीं होने के कारण थोड़ी कठिनाई होती थी। ठण्ड बहुत थी। सायंकाल को आँख खुली। बर्नीघाट का चप्पा-चप्पा घूम लेने के बाद हम खाना खाकर फिर सो गए। सुबह उठकर नदी के ठण्डे जल से मुँह हाथ धोया उदर में कुछ दाने डाले और लाखामण्डल की ओर पैदल चल पड़े। हमारे तम्बू तथा खाने का सामान दो खच्चरों ने सम्भाल रखा था।
