

Artist Linkin Park Album The Hunting Party Rating 7.9/10



Title Gone Author Michael Grant **Genre** Action, Adventure, Escapism

Michael Grant has taken these thoughts to a new platform with a fresh perspective in his new series "Gone".

The story is set in a small town in Southern California; Perdido where hell breaks loose when all of a sudden, everyone above the age of 15 disappear. One moment they are playing games, studying in their classes and going about the regular activities of life and the next, they are all gone.

What really runs in the story is the brutal murder of humanity as kids run around in stores, taking whatever they want. Small kids get drunk and smoke without anyone to stop them. Then steps in Sam, the protagonist of the story to try and get things in order.

The novel is action- packed as kids start developing strange powers. Abilities to control gravity, super speed and fire. Obnoxious kids from the nearby Coates Academy only add to the list of troubles with their own set of powers. As the story unfurls, we get to know of a deeper secret as to why the adults disappeared and what the mysterious, impregnable wall is that has stilled the ocean and stopped the wind.

Fierce rivalry between the two brothers. A 'mind-blowing' mystery. Unique powers with kids. Talking coyotes, water loving bats and man eating worms are only a few of the things that will get you absolutely absorbed in the story.

From a literary standpoint, this novel seems to have borrowed heavily from 'The Lord of The Flies', as it debates similar questions of what happens in society when authority disappears. The difference between them is that while Browning attempts to explain how this situation emerges and present this breakdown of society in a very poetic manner, Grant chooses to and fulfill the fantasies of children by giving them a fast- paced and action packed novel. The plot and writing could have been far more cohesive. All in all, 'Gone' is a fun read for kids, but doesn't hold much value for those looking for something intellectually stimulating.

Interview with the Chief Guest Mr. Ashish Rajpal

Mr Rajpal has been taught by noted psychologist Prof. Howard Gardener at the Harvard University. He is currently trying to transform the education system so that it can accommodate students from all walks of life. Oli: After having such a lively career in the corporate sector, what motivated you and inspired you to move into the field of education?

Mr. Rajpal: You know when I was about your age, I used to spend my summers trekking in the mountains. That was the time when we passed through villages and I'd see the children of those villages and maybe that must have sparked a little interest in wanting to do something for them. Coming from a middle class family I had to get a job and do the regular stuff to sustain the family. But somewhere that bug was there that maybe one day I'll go back and do it. After getting married and having my own children that lost interest of mine came back and I realized that now was the time. So that is how I got motivated into the field of education.

OLI: Sir, can you please tell us about the Schools of Tomorrow Conference?

MR. RAJPAL: See, what we are trying to do is to change schools, in the sense that it is time we move on from mugging up or simply copying text from the board as in a post Google world there is no point in actually memorizing definitions or even formulas for that matter. You might have a tiny little machine, which is highly portable that helps you to find 1,000 recipes of tomato soup. The challenge is what to do with that knowledge. Can you solve questions? Can you communicate? Can you convince people? These days schools are still following the typical techniques for teaching and so Schools of Tomorrow Conference tries to motivate schools, principals, leaders, parents to change the ethos of schools and prepare

kids for the future and not for yesterday.

OLI: So have you taken any measures that have proved to be successful?

MR. RAJPAL: The primary source of our work is a programme called "Xceed" where we go into schools, into their curriculum which is build around problem solving.

OLI: Sir do you believe in time where technology will actually replace human teachers?

MR. RAJPAL: I think teaching is going to change a lot in the next twenty years. It will be a dramatic change but I don't think that teachers are going to be replaced completely. Like today there are going to be good teachers and there are going to be bad teachers. I think what a teacher does today will be taken over by technology. But what technology cannot take over is mentorship, coaching, support, understanding the different problems of children and catering to those problems as per it demands to be perceived as. What technology can do is give individual time to each kid. And teachers who can embrace this would be even better. And people who try to fight this would lose this battle. So I don't think human beings are going away but the teaching will change.

OLI: And sir finally, what message do you have for the Welham fraternity?

MR. RAJPAL: Do something big with your life. Not anything small. You people are so fortunate as you have the right place, the right foundation. So just go out in the world and make it big.


Even though Welham Boys' School could not win individual awards, our experience does count and the skills we have learnt from this simulation exercise can't be ignored.



Choice works two ways. To wait for the School to set a limit, to curtail the number of activities you should participate in, would be encroaching on your right to make a choice. So, make an intelligent choice. On the other hand, let us not ignore the flip side of the argument for it makes sense too. There is no obvious logic in having only super talented individuals, instead society should lean itself towards making specialized individuals in their selected fields as well. Most modern careers require expert knowledge and skills, which can take years to acquire. We should not distract a student from developing skills in whatever selected field he or she has chosen to specialize in. After all, when you see a doctor or employ an engineer, you are not interested in how "well-rounded" they are, just whether they are good at their job. Most specialized professions still do not require us to compromise academic education by over-emphasis on non-academic activities. In that case too, the right choice will have to be made regarding the time and effort one needs to dedicate to one over the other, meaning the curriculum and the co curriculum.




Junaid Jan
