

THE UNFORGOTTEN WARRIOR

Refusing to believe the Second World War was over, Hiro Onoda continued fighting for thirty years in the jungles. Incredible but true. A case of extreme patriotism.

In the 1940's Japan had virtually a wave of conquests by thumping victories in Asia. The courage and valour of the Japanese soldiers was widely talked about. Hiro Onoda was one such soldier.

In 1944 he was sent to the Philippines island of Lubang (15 miles south west of Manila) and ordered to wage guerrilla war till his dying breath. Onoda was then just 22. He performed his duties seriously. He conducted a one-man guerrilla war against the natives of the Philippines but continued to do so for 2 decades (1950's-60's) because he did not learn of the end of the War.

His sabotage attacks on the ricefields of the Filippinos were so effective that hectic efforts were made to persuade this true patriotic soldier to realise that the War had ended. Bundles of Japanese newspapers were dropped near his hideout and he was showered with leaflets asking him to return. All efforts were in vain. He had been trained is the art of Psychological Warfare and knew its methods and effects. He believed the literature dropped at him was a trick by the Americans, his enemies. More endeavours were made to convince him. A Japanese flag was planted in the jungle. The signatures of his family members were inscribed

on it. He was unmoved. Onoda was sure that it was a trap because one of the names was misspelt.

As time passed so did the war technology. The jets flying overhead seemed more sophisticated. This strenghened Onoda's fears that war still raged on and now, even more fiercely.

In the jungle Onoda was not always alone. He had found his Man Friday, a fellow Japanese who worked with him till he was eventually killed in a police encounter in 1972. Even this did not deter Onoda. He kept struggling in the jungles, cleaning his guns and firing bullets on strategic locations.

Finally Norio Suzuki a teacher succeeded where others had failed. The teacher camped in the jungle of Lubang and made contact with Onoda to convince him of the end of the war. Finally Onoda surrendered in 1974.

It took a lot of time for him to adjust in the changed society. He still says 'People are so selfish and egoistic today. We must never forget others because man does not live alone!'

Today he runs a nature school where he teaches young enthusiasts jungle living and camping. He sadly realises how he wasted 28 years of his life to defend the honour of a nation long defeated.



Place the numbers 3 to 11 (both inclusive) so that the total is 21 in each row, column and both diagonals. The number 7 will be central, as shown.


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Place the following nine numbers so that the total is 99 in each row, column and both diagonals: 22, 23, 24, 32, 33, 34, 42, 43, and 44.
