Pakistan has already received forty F-16s but it will get an additional indisclosed number of this aircraft, rated as one of the most sophisticated aircraft in the world, according to sources close to the Pentagon.

Coca Cola or Pepsi Cola during their space odyssey. A

New type of "Star Wars" has generated by United States refreshment companies of being able to attain the priveledge of being the first to sell their products in space. Coca Cola and Pepsi Cola will extend their age old rivalry into space.

Coca Cola, however accuses the NASA of violating an agreement signed with it, granting the exclusive right of being the first space refreshment tinned in steel containers. However the National Aeronautics Space Administration of U.S. has denied the statement.

Paul Mc Cartney writes "In order to put out its misery the limping dog of a news story which has been dragging itself across our pages for the past year, my answer to the question, will the Beatles ever get together again" ......., is no, no." It is signed by Mc Cartney above a drawing of a toothy grin.

JAPAN EXPLODED ATOMIC BOMB AFTER HIROSHIMA BLAST: According to U.S. Government investigations and top secret documents, it has been established that Japan conducted a nuclear bomb test of its own, just four days after Hiroshima was destroyed. 
